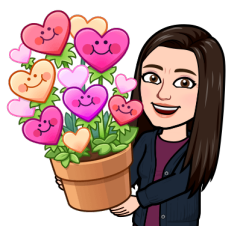

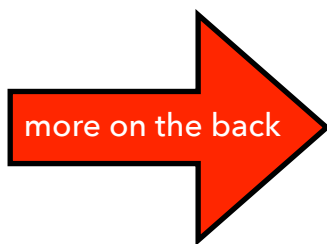

*Dress Code

As the weather (thankfully) gets warmer, we want to make sure we are being respectful and appropriate in our clothes at school. Because we are engaged in preparing students for Christian citizenship, we require modest and appropriate dress for the educational environment. Students and families are encouraged to use good taste and modesty in their mode of dress.

Students are running, climbing, sitting at desks and on the floor, and constantly moving. The clothing choices that students make must reflect the activities that they are doing. Flip flops/slides and short shorts/skirts are not practical for school days. Styles of dress become unacceptable when they go to extremes that threaten propriety.

We do not allow clothing with questionable slogans or images. Clothing that exposes the midriff or shirts with spaghetti straps are not acceptable (straps should be 2-3 finger widths wide). Hats and hoodies are not to be worn inside the school. Shorts and skirts should be mid-thigh or longer.

We ask that parents partner with us and understand that at times students may be asked to change their clothing if the administration has determined that the clothing choice is unacceptable dress for school. Students wearing inappropriate clothing will be asked to change their clothing immediately.
